Dear Parents/Carers

The news this week has been dominated by the announcement of England entering a second national lockdown. However, this lockdown, which many are branding as version 2.0, has different implications in that all secondary schools are expected to remain open and that parents are expected to send their children to their schools. Further to this the government have released confirmation that staff and students must wear face masks in corridors, inside communal areas and the PE changing rooms. As this was anticipated I asked you as parents to support us with this and I want to thank you since the vast majority of our students were able to comply with this from Monday.

From Monday November 9<sup>th</sup> the government are clear that face masks are mandatory and only students with evidenced medical conditions are exempt. Please be aware that students without evidenced medical conditions will be expected to follow the government mandate to wear masks. It is, therefore, important that we support the government's message and reiterate to your children that they must follow these guidelines to protect themselves, your family and our community. Thank you in advance of your cooperation.

Without wishing to tempt fate you will know that we have not had to close any classes or bubbles due to confirmed cases of covid-19. I want you to be reassured that we are following all safety and cleaning guidelines to the letter and are reminding students that they need to follow safe practices. I want to remind you that in the event of a bubble or class closure students will continue to receive learning through the normal curriculum remotely and this will be through recorded or live lessons. We hope we never have to use that contingency, but it is vital that TQEA students continue to receive the first class education they deserve in any eventuality.

On a different note it was heartening to see us launch our campaign to support children who are in challenging circumstances this Christmas. We are asking for students to bring in items to create a box with small gifts in for a child's Christmas present. This is to ensure that they get a gift this Christmas in circumstances in which ordinarily they would receive nothing. Students have been asked to contribute one item which can be a brand new toy such as a doll, cuddly toy or toy cars, school supplies and/or hygiene items. As a staff at TQEA we are looking to also sponsor local families in our community so that they receive the ingredients for a Christmas dinner. We know how important it is that we reach out to our community at this challenging time.

Finally, with year 11 mock examinations approaching, please support and encourage your child with their revision. Our revision sessions after school are well attended and we expect your child to attend, so that they are well prepared and any gaps in knowledge are closed. We have given a very clear message to Year 11 that every test and examination matters particularly because we are being told to expect normal examinations in the summer, but do not know what the reality will be moving forwards.

# Is your child eligible?

One of the effects of the COVID 19 Pandemic is the changes to our home and financial situations.

If your financial situation has changed and you receive of any of the following your child may be able to get free school meals;

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not benefits you get)


If your child is in any of the following categories, the school

extra funding through the Pupil Pupil Premium programme which will enable us to provide additional support and resources to benefit your child's education at TQEA:

- In receipt of Free School Meals
- · A looked after child
- A previously looked after child

- A child with a parent who is retired with a pension from Ministry of Defence.
- A child who has been adopted

If any of the above situations applies to your family due to a change in circumstances and we are not already aware, please contact the school and we can assist you further.

We would also remind you that failure to secure a child's regular attendance at school may be a criminal offence under Section 444(1) or 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996 which makes it clear that it is parents responsibility to ensure their child's attendance at the school at which they are on roll. Failure to ensure attendance may result in a referral to the Warwickshire Attendance Service which could result in prosecution.

This year there is a change to our attendance approach. There will be incentives for the students and families alongside amendments to our non-attendance policy.

#### PA / Low attendance family's incentive

#### Procedure for Non – Attendance

\*More than 2 late arrivals in a week will result in a 30-minute detention on a Friday afternoon\*

We expect parents to call us each day of an absence before 9am (even if we know it is a long term absence)

If we don't hear from parents within 15 minutes of register closing, they will be sent a text to contact us urgently.

We will continue to call home for any parent who has not contacted us until we speak to them (including work numbers).

A Medical note will be requested for any absence exceeding 3 days. We no longer accept a prescription as evidence of medical reason.
