


New GCSE grading system



Y9 is a key year



- Three year GCSE
- Taught GCSE content that will be revisited in Y10 or 11.
- Home learning is GCSE related, covering skills needed to succeed in the exams.
- In class and end of unit assessments are exam questions.





Targets

- These are set at the start of Y9 for the three year GCSE
- They are based on prior attainment and offer a level of realistic challenge.
- They are set so that students can achieve above the National average for their ability.
- They can go up. Aspirational.





Key words parents should understand

<u>Target grade</u> – the level your child is expected to achieve by the end of GCSE. This is based on their prior attainment.







<u>Currently working at level</u> – where they are now.

What they are achieving at the moment.

U – At the top of the level

M- In the middle

L – just into the level













