Dear Parents/Carers

We hope you had a pleasant Easter and are enjoying the lovely weather!

Students have returned in a calm and purposeful manner to the academy this week. On Monday we had a re-connection assembly with Year 10, outlining the support opportunities we are giving them with their GCSE examinations a short year away! As part of our support package we have bought membership to receive GCSE Pod which offers materials and tutorial videos to help students close gaps in their knowledge. Staff are mentoring Y10 students to consider aspirations, ambitions and career pathways and to give lessons in how to learn effectively. Year 10 have examinations in June and this is a great opportunity for them to avail themselves of the additional extended day booster sessions and excellent support that we will be giving them. Our message to Year 10 has been to focus on action now in order to maximise their opportunities in the future.

This week I proudly received notification from SSAT (the schools' network) that TQEA has been awarded "Leading Edge" status once more. This status has come about from the excellent standards here at TQEA which has seen us branded as a high performing academy. This status is awarded to schools that are looking to innovate and improve through collaboration with other schools. We do this regularly with academies in our Trust, the Academy Transformation Trust, and it means we can learn from the best that education has to offer. As we continue our journey to offer an extraordinary education to all TQEA students, this is a timely reminder of how far TQEA has come in recent years.

I wanted to thank the very many parents and carers who have supported the academy by re-affirming that their child needs to be in the academy on time each day. As a result punctuality has improved dramatically and students are ready and in place for learning at 8:45am. Please continue to support us by ensuring that your child leaves home to arrive at the academy in good time to start the day as focused and refreshed as possible for the learning day ahead.

On my regular tours around the academy this week I have seen some fantastic lessons and work going on. One highlight was students in Year 8 talking to me about their love of Gothic Literature and being fascinated to learn about Ancient Greece. This is prior to their work studying the Epic Greek poem, "The Iliad" by Homer. The curriculum in English has been superbly crafted to ensure that all students make progress and from September we are launching our Curriculum 2021 across the whole academy which will be offering a challenging, exciting and extraordinary education for all TQEA students. Not only does this new curriculum diet serve students in the classroom, but will also relate to leadership, character development, skills development, employability skills and wider experiences. It is exciting work and I will be delighted to share it with you later in this academic term.

Finally, our Senior and Junior Leadership teams have played significant and important roles in the interview process for new TQEA staff this week. It is lovely to hear the candidates talk about how polite, respectful and thoughtful TQEA students are. They also commented about how committed the students were to ensuring that they had teachers who would ensure that they would learn well. Of course, you know this already, but your children continue to do us and yourselves proud.

Your support in this matter is much appreciated.







## Is your child eligible?

One of the effects of the COVID 19 Pandemic is the changes to our home and financial situations.

If your financial situation has changed and you receive of any of the following your child may be able to get free school meals;

**Income Support** 

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance

**Income-related Employment and Support Allowance** 

Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

The guaranteed element of Pension Credit

Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)

Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If your child is in any of the following categories, the school can apply for extra funding through the

Pupil Premium programme which will enable us to provide additional support

and resources to benefit your child's education at TQEA:

Pupil Premium

In receipt of Free School Meals

A looked after child

A previously looked after child

A child with a parent currently serving in HM Armed Forces.

A child with a parent who is retired with a pension from Ministry of Defence.

A child who has been adopted

If any of the above situations applies to your family due to a change in circumstances and we are not already aware, please contact the school and we can assist you further.

Families who are already in receipt of Free school meals and Pupil Premium funding will shortly be receiving a survey from TQEA to assist with our support package this year. We would be grateful if you could complete the survey and return to the school.

We would also remind you that failure to secure a child's regular attendance at school may be a criminal offence under Section 444(1) or 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996 which makes it clear that it is parents responsibility to ensure their child's attendance at the school at which they are on roll. Failure to ensure attendance may result in a referral to the Warwickshire Attendance Service which could result in prosecution.

This year there is a change to our attendance approach. There will be incentives for the students and families alongside amendments to our non-attendance policy.

## PA / Low attendance family's incentive

Family incentive award – gift card / voucher for family use if attendance improves by set amount

### Procedure for Non – Attendance

\*More than 2 late arrivals in a week will result in a 30-minute detention on a Friday afternoon\*

We expect parents to call us each day of an absence before 9am (even if we know it is a long term absence)

If we don't hear from parents within 15 minutes of register closing, they will be sent a text to contact us urgently.

We will continue to call home for any parent who has not contacted us until we speak to them (including work numbers).

A Medical note will be requested for any absence exceeding 3 days. We no longer accept a prescription as evidence of medical reason.
