Dear Parents/Carers

This week we have been very much focused around the work we are doing with Teacher Assessed Grades for our wonderful Year 11 cohort. As you can imagine there has been a great deal of additional endeavour required for TQEA staff in terms of administering the assessments, marking the work and meeting to moderate and standardise the papers. On Monday we held standardisation meetings and invited some of the members of our Local Academy Committee to observe the processes that meet the requirements of JCQ, the examinations regulator. What has been evident is the focused professionalism of the TQEA staff in ensuring all of these processes support our students in achieving the grades, which are in line with the evidence produced by students.

On a heart-warming note we are very busy planning an event for Year 11 on Friday May 28th to celebrate their time here. The Year 11s have been consulted and are asking for red carpets, photographs, inflatables and the AstroTurf pitch. We are providing barbecue style food and are very much looking forward to the occasion. After the challenges we have all faced during this pandemic it will be a lovely afternoon for staff and students. Please keep fingers crossed for lovely weather!

At TQEA it is important to us that we develop our staff to the full in order for them to have the largest impact as educators. Mrs Hopkins, our Assistant Principal for Teaching & Learning, has led teachers to engage in independent and purposeful practice with students around the ideas of modelling work for success! I have seen great examples of this in the classroom this week including a PE lesson in which a circle of students were being asked to collaborate, think critically and show leadership to lift a ball with multiple ropes. It was interesting to see how the students related positively with one another to achieve the task and were Incredibly motivated to succeed together. Developing leadership habits such as these is so important in young people.

I also wish to go on record this week to thank Mr Jennens for presenting a cheque to Mrs Deeley, Curriculum Leader for Music, and myself from the Atherstone Music Bursary. We are grateful for the award and will be using it to provide much needed musical instruments and music technology to the Music department.

Finally, the vast majority of students at TQEA do not receive any detentions since they exhibit excellent behaviour all the time, but a small number do, from time to time, for breaching our behaviour policy. We operate a same day detention policy here at TQEA which is communicated to parents and carers in real time on Class Charts. The purpose of the same day detention is that it is very effective in helping each student to reconcile their behaviour from that day and have a fresh start the following day. This supports the idea of students reflecting on and modifying their actions moving forwards. We do want to work with parents and carers and on the odd occasion, and for legitimate reasons, can re-arrange a detention when a parent and carer calls to explain the situation. However, please support us by ensuring that any re-arrangements are a rare occurrence to ensure that your child can serve any detentions and can have the fresh start the next day. Your support is most appreciated!

Is your child eligible?

One of the effects of the COVID 19 Pandemic is the changes to our home and financial situations.

If your financial situation has changed and you receive of any of the following your child may be able to get free school meals;

Income Support Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance Income-related Employment and Support Allowance Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 The guaranteed element of Pension Credit Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190) Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit Universal Credit - if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

If your child is in any of the following categories, the school can apply for extra funding through the Pupil Premium programme which will enable us to provide additional support and resources to benefit your child's education at TQEA: Pupil

In receipt of Free School Meals A looked after child A previously looked after child A child with a parent currently serving in HM Armed Forces. A child with a parent who is retired with a pension from Ministry of Defence. A child who has been adopted

If any of the above situations applies to your family due to a change in circumstances and we are not already aware, please contact the school and we can assist you further.

Families who are already in receipt of Free school meals and Pupil Premium funding will shortly be receiving a survey from TQEA to assist with our support package this year. We would be grateful if you could complete the survey and return to the school.

We would also remind you that failure to secure a child's regular attendance at school may be a criminal offence under Section 444(1) or 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996 which makes it clear that it is parents responsibility to ensure their child's attendance at the school at which they are on roll. Failure to ensure attendance may result in a referral to the Warwickshire Attendance Service which could result in prosecution.

This year there is a change to our attendance approach. There will be incentives for the students and families alongside amendments to our non-attendance policy.

Every half term

PA / Low attendance family's incentive

Family incentive award – gift card / voucher for family use if attendance improves by set amount

Procedure for Non – Attendance

We expect parents to call us each day of an absence before 9am (even if we know it is a long term absence)

If we don't hear from parents within 15 minutes of register closing, they will be sent a text to contact us urgently.

We will continue to call home for any parent who has not contacted us until we speak to them (including work numbers).

A Medical note will be requested for any absence exceeding 3 days. We no longer accept a prescription as evidence of medical reason.

Dental Check up's/ Routine Dentist Appointments

Just a reminder that dentist appointments are not medical appointments and should be taken outside of school hours. Any Dentist appointment taken during school hours will be recorded as an unauthorised absence.
