Dear Parents and Carers.

On Monday some of our Year 7 and Year 8 students had the amazing opportunity to visit the Priory tennis club in Birmingham for the Rothesay Classic grass court championship. This is one of the main tournaments used on the tennis tour in preparation for Wimbledon. The students had an exceptional time and were able to witness Harriet Dart, one of Britain's top players, in action. These types of opportunities are all part of our Curriculum '21 commitment to give students the experience of seeing live sport.

Mr Stewart, our Diversity Lead, announced plans for various events next week as we celebrate our Diversity Week. These include Diversity Week Mario Kart Tournament at lunchtime from Monday 20th June until Thursday 23rd June in the Drama studio. Entry to the tournament is £2 with proceeds going to the "Just Like Us" children's charity. That is followed by Rainbow Friday in which students can celebrate what makes them unique by wearing a coloured tie, hat, scarf, headband or flag. Finally, our Diversity student group has prepared a student survey this week to gather views on what we do well in promoting diversity at TQEA and where we can improve. We are interested to see the results and plan for the future.

Year 10 are being supported in preparation of their mock examinations which start on Monday 27 th June. Initially, these examinations start with Core (English, Maths and Science) and E-Bacc (Geography, History, Computer Science and Languages) subjects and take place in the Sports Hall to give students a flavour of how examinations will work next summer. These examinations are a continuation of the assessments that students have been completing all year and will provide information about subject areas of strength and knowledge gaps which need to be closed this summer. Year 10 parents and carers are invited to our progress evening on Thursday July 14th to discuss their child's progress and plan support for the future. This will be accompanied by reports to ensure parents and carers are aware of their child's results.

Finally, you may be aware that TQEA has been supported for many years by our Charity Trust, Chaired by Hugh Nethercot. The purpose of the Charitable Trust is to provide financial support to educational projects which benefit TQEA students directly. I want to go on record to state that we are extremely fortunate and grateful for the work of the Charitable Trust, which has provided amazing opportunities for our students including trips subsidies, student rewards, additional curriculum resources and books. The Trustees are looking to recruit a volunteer to act as Treasurer. I can confirm that there is not a huge time commitment with this role and there are few meetings during the year. However, it is a role, if you can spare a few hours and have the skills, in which you would directly be able to support TQEA students in ensuring that they benefit from the generosity of the TQEA Charitable Trust.



Peripatetic Lessons Peripatetic lessons are flying this week, we have 49 students having lessons and some working towards their grade exams.


Sophia Jabra - Year 10 Congratulations to Sophia in year 10 for passing her grade 3 piano exam with a distinction!! What an outstanding achievement!


