The purpose of the evening was to ensure that our Year 11 parents and carers, many accompanied by their children, were aware of the work we are doing to support Year 11 in this all-important examination year. We explained the power of a good set of GCSE results in a persons' life, revealed some proven revision techniques and lifted the lid on our Careers and applications support. It was an evening where we presented our Year 11 with their examination timetables for next summer, gave out complimentary revision guides and shared our intervention timetables. I was delighted by the amazing support of our parents and carers and the continued forging of the partnership which will support their child this year. After two years of doing the GCSE Success Evening in a different way due to the pandemic, it was fantastic to have us all in a room together again!

On a related note we wish Year 11 well in the next two weeks as they complete their mock examinations. 
Curriculum In Action #8
