

Please see below some useful links for over the Christmas Period.

The holiday activities and food (HAF) programme is for school aged children in full time education from reception to Year 11 (inclusive), who receive benefits related free school meals. The programme offers valuable support to families on lower incomes, giving young people the opportunity to access activities with a healthy meal provision over the main school holidays at Christmas, Easter and Summer.

All Details on the HAF programme can be found at https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/ holidays-activities-food-haf.

If a family is not eligible for free school meals, but meet the criteria referenced at https://searchout.warwickshire.gov.uk/homepage/31/information-for-parents---haf then a referral can be made for a HAF code. This will only be for Christmas and need to be re-issued for each activity period as we can only allocate a certain number of codes for families not in receipt of free school meals. A referral needs to be made by a professional worker supporting the family, unfortunately we are unable to process requests from families directly.
