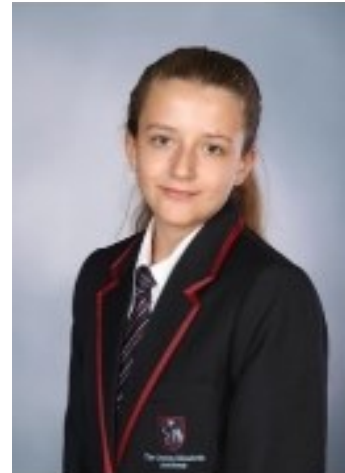

# Curriculum In Action #9

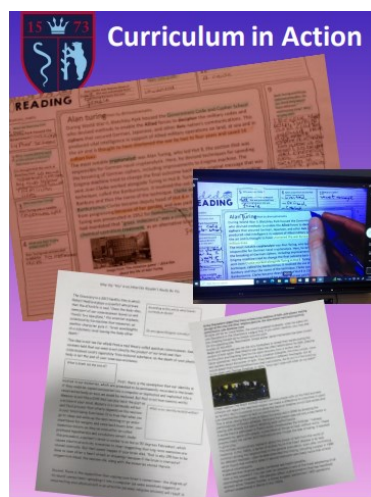
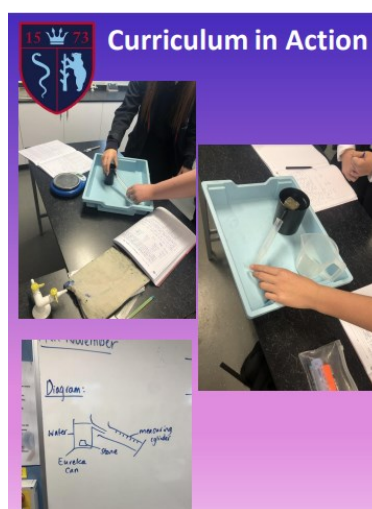
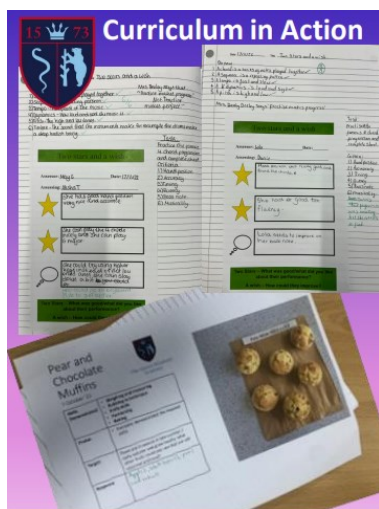

Page Three: A range of oracy strategies this week: evidence here from RE, English and Mrs Knight's discussion mat.

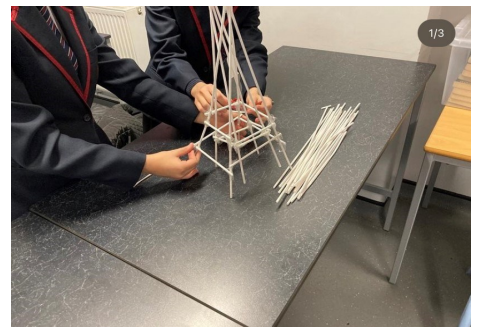
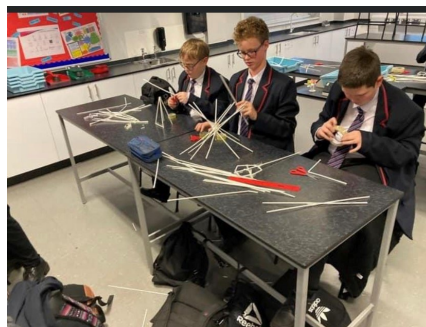
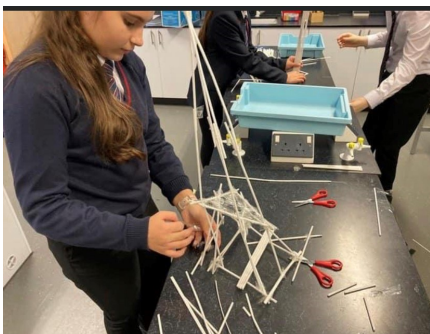
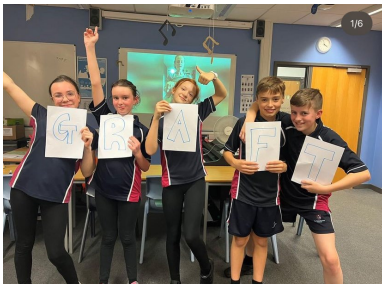
