Dear Parents and Carers,


Page One: Independent learning in Y10 Hospitality and Catering, and adaptive teaching with students split between completing a practical while others are completing theory.


Page Two: Pride shown in Y9 STEM: students learning new skills and using solder to fuse paper clips into figures.


