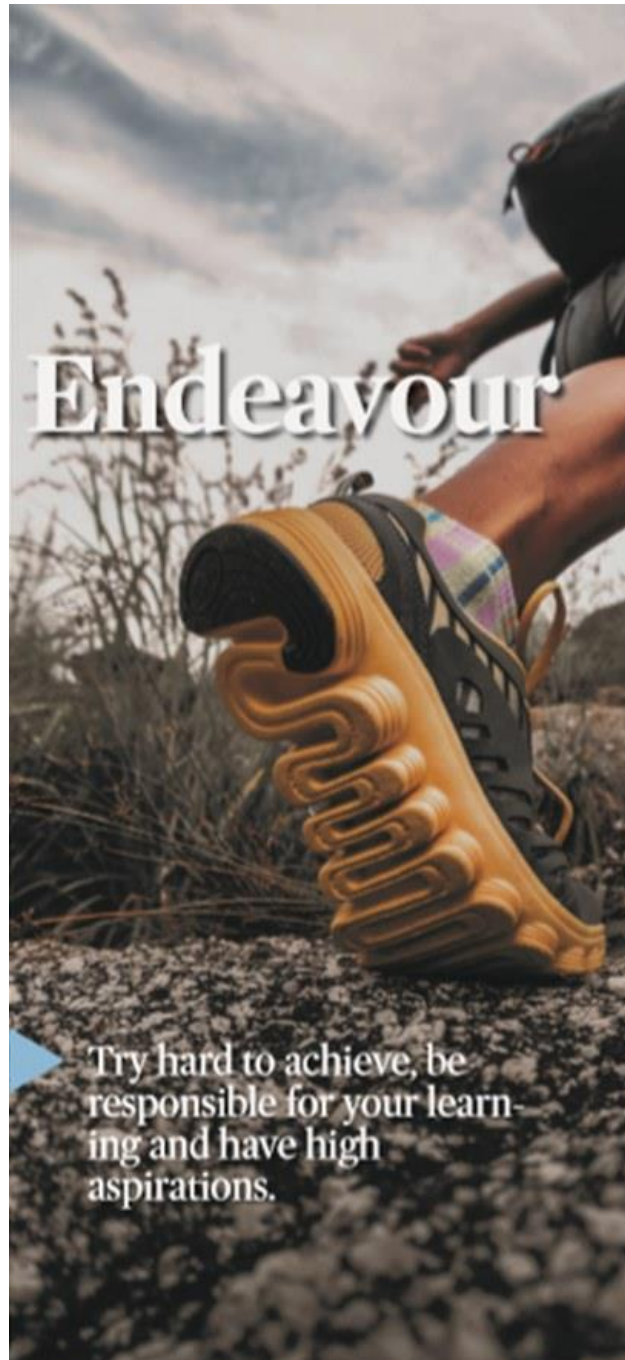

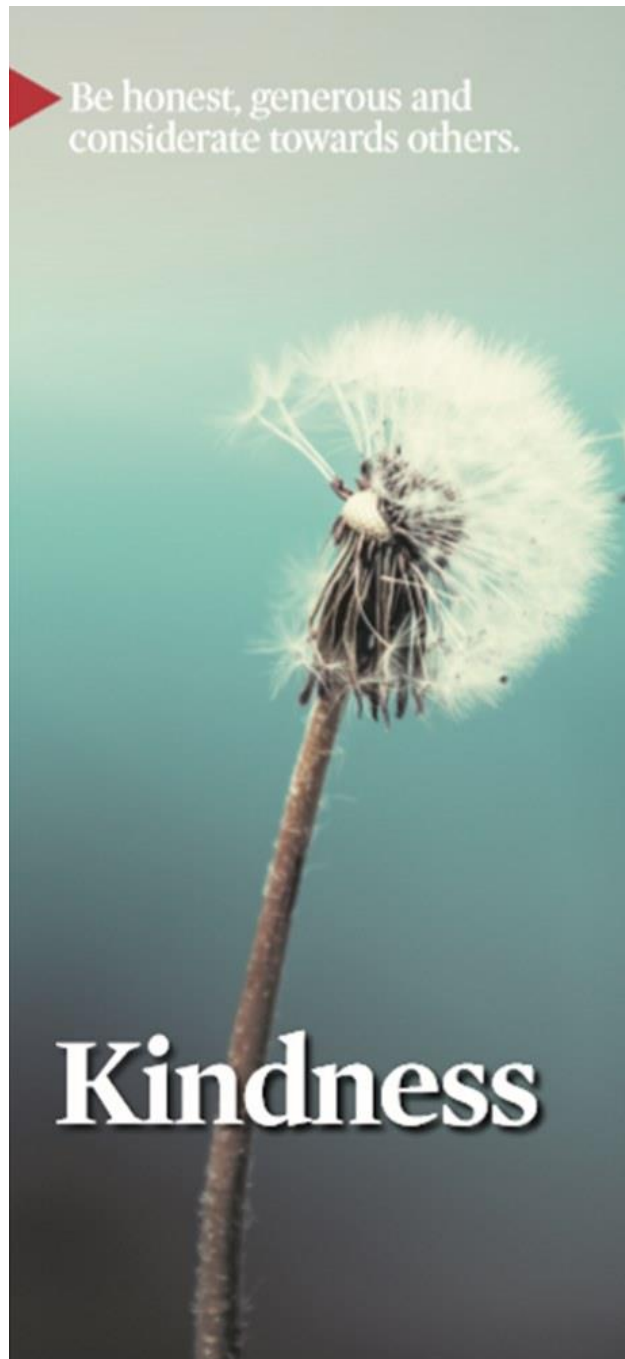
Resilience
