



The RE and Art departments were delighted to take 47 Year 10 students on a joint trip to Coventry Cathedral, providing an enriching day that combined creative exploration with meaningful religious and historical learning. Students began with a guided tour of the cathedral, where they had the opportunity to experience the remarkable architecture and view the powerful artworks on display. This set the scene for a deeper understanding of the cathedral's significance, both as a place of worship and as a symbol of peace and reconciliation.

Following the tour, students took part in two subject-specific workshops. In RE, they explored the cathedral's role within the Christian faith, examining themes of forgiveness, resilience, and community. Meanwhile, the Art workshop encouraged students to respond creatively to the cathedral's unique atmosphere and its collection of modern and traditional artworks.

The quality of the artwork produced was exceptional. Students experimented with a range of materials and techniques, creating striking scratchboards, expressive charcoal studies and delicate acetate drawings inspired by the cathedral's stained/etched glass and sculptural forms. Their enthusiasm, experimentation and attention to detail were evident throughout.

This visit has not only deepened students' knowledge and appreciation of both subjects but will also prove invaluable as they continue their GCSE studies next year. The experiences,


insights, and practical skills gained during the trip will undoubtedly support and strengthen their upcoming coursework.

Overall, it was a highly successful day, and both departments are incredibly proud of the maturity and creativity shown by all involved.


























Joyful Learning


