

Head of Academy Welcome

Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy first week of December!

As we approach December, many of us look forward to the festive joy and excitement it brings. However, we also recognise that this time of year can be more challenging for some children and families. Each year, we support members of our community through our Christmas Hamper initiative, and I would like to extend my sincere thanks to Miss Nichols for her hard work in organising and coordinating this effort. Within the Academy, we strive to balance festive celebrations with academic expectations, ensuring that students enjoy the Christmas break while returning in January ready to embrace the new academic challenges of the Spring Term.

I would like to reiterate the message from our previous newsletter regarding the importance we place on learning within the academy. We have high expectations for all students and expect them to be in lessons and actively engaged in learning. As you would expect, we cannot allow students to walk around the academy or ignore instructions. While most of our students are exceptional, a small number are causing disruption either by not attending lessons or by disturbing learning environments. As I outlined in my initial letter as Head of Academy, I will always uphold the highest standards and strive to maintain a culture that supports learning. Unfortunately, this minority of students are having a significant impact on the learning of others and on our staff's ability to deliver an outstanding curriculum. This behaviour is being addressed by our Pastoral Team, and I thank parents and carers for your continued support in tackling this concern.


In addition, we are seeing an increasing number of students using their mobile phones in school and openly having them out during the academy day. Mobile phones can be a distraction to learning and can negatively impact the classroom environment. They also have the potential to be a safeguarding concern. This is fully supported by the DfE who state that schools should prohibit the use of mobile phones in schools. For this reason, our policy is that mobile phones must be switched off and kept in school bags during the Academy day. This ensures that students remain focused on their lessons and enables us to fulfil our duty to create an environment that is calm, safe and free from distractions where students can thrive. If a student is found using a mobile phone without permission, it will be confiscated in line with our behaviour policy and taken to reception. They will be able to collect it from reception at the end of the day. If a student continues to not follow this expectation, the mobile phone will need to be collected by parents/carers or they simply will not be allowed to have a mobile phone in school. If you have a need to contact your child, please can we remind you that this should be done through the office not by you directly contacting them. We appreciate the support of parents and carers in reinforcing this expectation, as it helps us maintain a safe and productive learning environment for all.

We look forward to the two remaining tournaments before Christmas ahead!


