

Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to the second half of our Autumn Term. We have so much to look forward to this half term, including the full launch of our XTRA programme, which will offer clubs ranging from sports to creative arts, ensuring there is something for everyone. In addition, there are a number of activities planned across departments, as well as forthcoming Rewards and Attendance events, and preparations for Christmas. The week began with our students who earned the most achievement points last half term receiving a complimentary cookie from the canteen. Thank you to Ms Shepherd for organising this and ensuring students are recognised and rewarded for meeting our academy values.

This week, we were delighted to welcome our students back to the academy, and it was wonderful to see their enthusiasm and positive attitude. We are pleased that the majority of students returned proudly wearing their uniforms correctly, and we truly appreciate your ongoing support in helping us uphold our standards and ensuring your child wears the correct uniform. Our uniform policy states that students should wear black formal trousers—please note that black jeans, jeggings, and leggings are not permitted. Students may choose to wear a pleated skirt; however, it is important that the skirt is of an appropriate length for a school environment, falling no more than three inches above the knee. These guidelines help us maintain a sense of equality and professionalism within our academy community.

We continue to remind students about skirt length and appreciate your support in encouraging them to meet these expectations.

Additionally, students may wear only one stud earring in each ear, and we kindly ask that all other piercings, including nose piercings, are either removed or replaced with a clear retainer, as outlined in our uniform policy. Thank you for your ongoing cooperation in supporting these standards. If you have any concerns or need assistance with obtaining the correct uniform items, please contact the academy office for support. We are here to help and want to ensure every student feels included and prepared for their learning.

Year 11 are approaching their final week before the start of their mock examinations. These are important preparations for their GCSE examinations. Students have been working exceptionally hard in the classroom, making the most of their Prep time intervention sessions, and attending Supercharge. Your support in ensuring they attend Supercharge sessions is greatly appreciated as well as the gentle encouragement to continue working independently at home. 


Joyful Learning


